NON-PERISHABLE FOOD COLLECTION: We continue to collect non-perishables of all kinds for the food pantries.

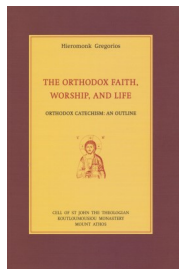
NEWSPAPERS: Salfid Rescue Kennel, our neighbor on Clearview Road, is always in need of old newspapers. Look for the box in the hallway.

A Message from Fr Noah

Dear Saint Philip's Family,

We have the great blessing of hosting this month a bright and holy man of God from Lebanon, Metropolitan Ephraim Kyriakos. He is the brother Raymond and uncle of the Jamil, Joseph, and Raja. Please enjoy the following very brief biography.

He was born in Beirut, Lebanon on April 15, 1943, the son of Jamil Kyriakos and Alice Manassah. Eventually he studied engineering in Paris, France before working in his field in the construction of a subway station and then teaching in Beirut and Tripoli where he also led the Orthodox Youth Movement center in Beirut.

In 1972, Ephraim left his secular career at Balamand and then Thessalonica. He was ordained a deacon in 1974 and a priest in 1978. In Greece, Ephraim entered the monastic community when he was tonsured a monk at the Monastery of St. Paul on Mount Athos on October 16, 1983. At his tonsure, he received his name "Ephraim", in honor of Ephraim the Syrian. After Ephraim returned to Lebanon, he established his own monastery in Nahr Baskinta, near Biq'aata, Holy Archangel Michael Monastery. Ephraim was elevated to archimandrite 1991. On October 18, 2009 in the Marian Church Damascus he was elevated to arch-episcopacy and was received in Tripoli the following day in festivities at the Saint George Cathedral.

He will be with us from Nov 10-17. Please come to receive his blessing, hear his teaching, and be edified by his deep prayerful peace – especially at the Nov 12th Hierarchical Divine Liturgy.

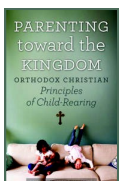

BE LED BY THE SPIRIT, NOT PUSHED BY THE PASSIONS (Romans 8:12-14)

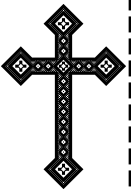
