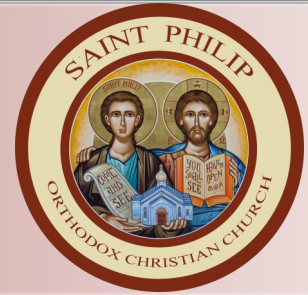

A Message from Fr. Noah

Dear Saint Philip's Family,
The journey through the Paschal Season to Pentecost and beyond is the story of God's self-giving love for us, and our call to participate in that love and share that love with one another and the world. To not share in this love is not simply to miss the point, it is to reject the story of God as our story—it is to reject being Christ's disciples:

By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another (John 13.35)

It is to reject the Holy Spirit's dynamic work in us as our Paraklete, our Helper and Advocate.

Christ calls us to high ideals, and the

stakes our high. Our keeping of Christ's commandments is not optional—and the urgency becomes that much clearer when the divisions and conflicts of the world encroach on our unity and harmony as the Church.

I am confident, however, that we at St. Philip have and will continue to rise above the worldly cacophony, and maintain "the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph 4.3). Our cultivation of humility and availing ourselves of the Sacrament of Confession must be at the center of our life at St. Philip, if we wish to remain in the center of God's will and work in us for the life of the world.

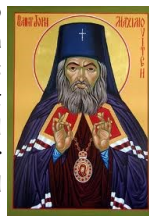

**Walking in the Steps of the
American Saints**

**SERVE GOD BY SERVING THE
CHURCH**

St John Maximovich, who passed into eternal life in Seattle on July 2nd, 1966, was a brilliant and erudite, yet simple, joyful, and very fruitful servant of God's Church. After studies in Serbia, he dedicated his life to monasticism as well as the pastoral ministries of prayer, teaching, preaching, building churches, and caring for orphans. This took him from Ukraine to Shanghai to the Philippines to Europe and finally to San Francisco. His letter to a young man seeking direction for his life and career, is a strong reminder for us to "answer the call" for ministry, whether it be our life's work or part of our parish involvement:



"When I meet and observe the lives of those whom I knew as young people and who have now reached a ripe age, I see how weighed down they are with worldly cares and sicknesses, how bleakly they spend their days if they have no higher yearnings. But those who give themselves to God's service, even if they suffer for it, are spiritually vibrant and feel God's hand protecting them."

**UPDATE FROM ST. PHILIP'S
BUILDING COMMITTEE**

To accommodate the continued growth in our parish, the St Philip Building Committee has been formed for Phase III as a timely planning effort for our church expansion. From an historical perspective the building of St Philip Church can be summarized in phases:

- + Phase I: 1991 dedication for new church and utility wing up to kitchen area
- + Phase II: 1996 added Office, Sunday School, Great Room, moved Narthex wall back by 8 feet

A Phase III expansion effort is now underway to meet the needs for more/better capacity in all areas to accommodate growth. Our parish currently has \$200,000 available funds for this building expansion.

With the St Nicholas House property acquisition there is now a need to look globally at the total parish needs so that the entire St Philip property can be planned to meet long-term needs in addition to the immediate need for space and organization.

Over the last two months Committee members have been tasked with seeking input from clergy and parishioners in four key areas:

- + Worship
- + Hospitality & Bathrooms
- + Education & Office
- + External property

The committee has agreed to treat the spiritual needs of the parish in the building plan as top priority.

At this point we are aggregating and prioritizing the feedback to provide to the architect so that a proposal of design options can be put forth for further review!
